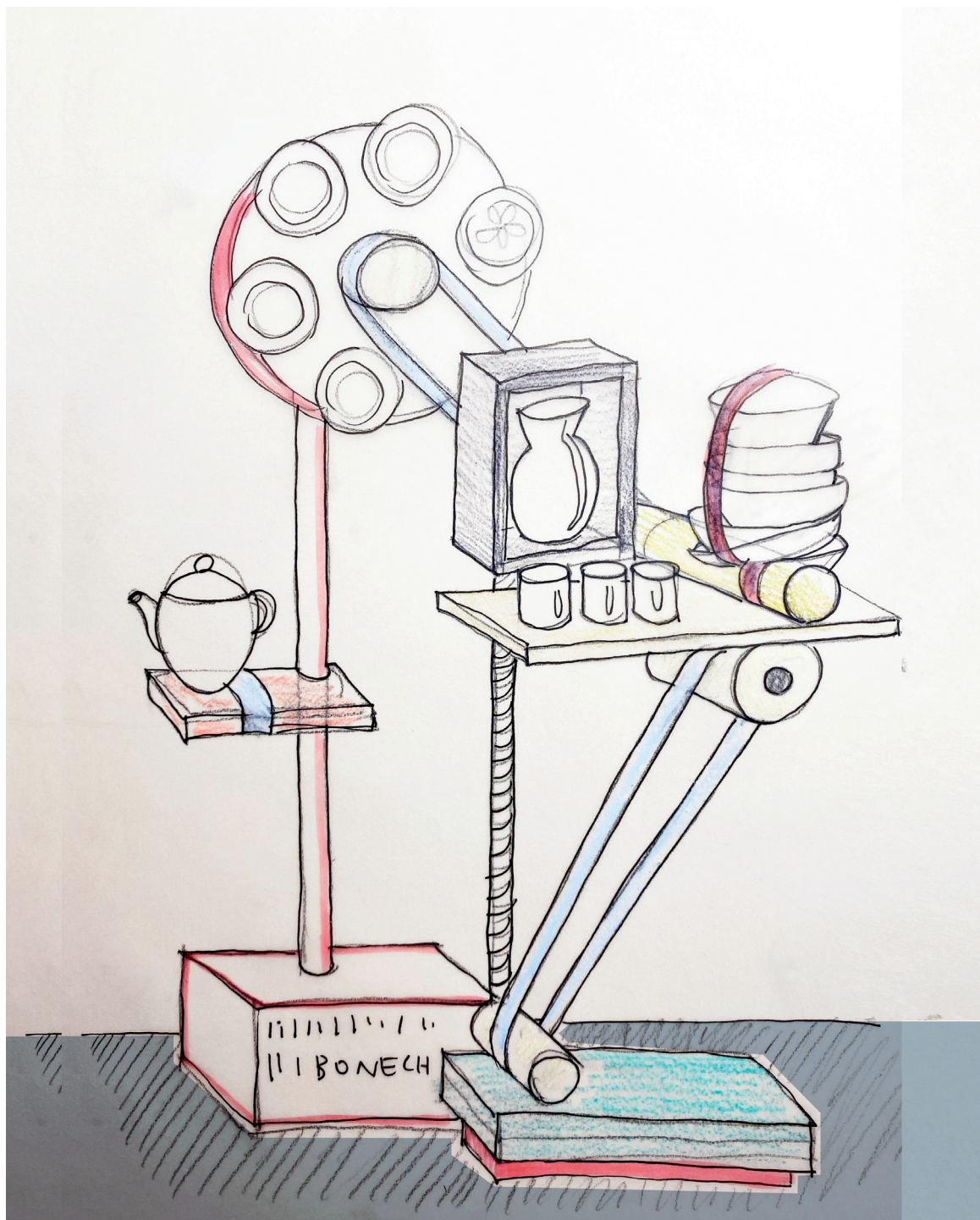

Fine Bone China is the most sophisticated and technically demanding product in ceramic production. DIBBERN's particularly light, elegant Fine Bone China is produced in traditional and sensitive handwork one hundred per cent in Germany, Bavaria. With time, dedication, care and experience, the cups and plates are traditionally turned to achieve the highest quality. It withstands the daily 'high traffic' and, being designed as a modular mix-and-match concept, offers equivalent flexibility. Its creamy white, brilliant, translucent material is at the same time long-lasting, durable and incomparable in its fine appeal.

*DIBBERN, the Hamburg porcelain manufacturer,
combines centuries-old tradition and contemporary design.*

At the end of the 1990s, DIBBERN took over Germany's first private porcelain manufacturer, Hutschenreuther, which was founded in 1814. DIBBERN has been producing its Fine Bone China collections here at the original factory in Hohenberg, Bavaria, ever since. This particularly light Fine Bone China is made traditionally and for the most part handcrafted delicately by more than 100 employees. With time, dedication and experience, the cups and plates are traditionally turned to achieve the highest quality and produce the ultra-thin Fine Bone China that is both sturdy and resistant to breakage.

The essential aesthetics of the design, the feel and the know-how handed down celebrate the ritual of a modern table culture. Complex craftsmanship and quality monitoring at the highest level make each piece of DIBBERN Fine Bone China unique - for everyday use.

Alongside the collection for a private international clientele, DIBBERN also designs and manufactures custom-made Fine Bone China items for top addresses in the hospitality and F&B segment and counts the Federal Chancellery, Lufthansa's First Class, Bulgari Hotels & Resorts and other luxury hotels among its customers.

Another pillar of the porcelain company's success is the porcelain series 'Solid Color'. The Bauhaus-inspired design from the 1930s, enhanced with a colored rim, secured DIBBERN's breakthrough in the 1980s and has become a highly awarded design classic.

Today, the company founded by Bernd T. Dibbern in the early 1970s, is managed by the new generation, the sons Jan and Ben Dibbern. Today, DIBBERN products are sold in the company's own flagship store in Hamburg and through selected premium retailers.

| 1980 | Solid Color, a Bauhaus-inspired porcelain series from the 1930s, is reinterpreted in a variety of colors by DIBBERN. |
| 1996 | Hutschenreuther closes the factory in Hohenberg. |
| 1997 | DIBBERN takes over the original factory in Hohenberg and continues production at the highest level in accordance with centuries of tradition. |
| 2007 | DIBBERN opens flagship store in the heart of Hamburg. |
| 2016 | Jan and Ben Dibbern take over the management.
Dibbern employs around 150 people at the headquarters near Hamburg, in the flagship store and in the factory. |
| 2023 | First presentation at the Milan Design Week 2023 and presentation of the joint lighting collection in collaboration with the designer Tobias Grau. |
| 2024 | For the second time DIBBERN is present at Milan Design Week in the heart of Brera, to stage a selection of Fine Bone China in an artistic installation and to demonstrate the process of porcelain making. |
